Consultation/Guidelines regarding Green Belt Development.

Sir.

With reference to the above, we would like to inform you that we have paid a visit to the area developed as Green Belt inside the campus of your company on 12/08/2014.

We appreciate your sincere effort to fulfill the conditions for environmental clearance specified by the Ministry of Environment & Forests, New Delhi. We are happy to see that you are taking steps to follow the guidelines issued by the Central Pollution Control Board. The existing species are found to be balancing with the ecology and we have noticed that these have been maintained properly and are in good condition.

In this connection, we would like to communicate the following suggestions/guidelines that are to be generally followed while carrying out the work of Green Belt Development:-

Plants like teak and eucalyptus are not eco-friendly for the purpose of Green Belt development. Teaks (seguns) deteriorate the quality of the soil and eucalyptuses reduce the water level. As such, these species are not recommended for plantation. Similarly, species like cashew nut etc. are not recommended as they do not balance with the ecology.

Further, we suggest the plantation of saplings of the species like neem, ficus infectoria, rain tree, nahar, bokul, mango, jack-fruit etc. in order to ensure ecological development.
